Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarships

It is time to fill out the 2022 Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarship applications. Applications can be downloaded at: https://texas4hfoundation.org

The guidelines, tips and application portal can be found at texas4hfoundation.org under the scholarships tab. Applicants must be in the upper 1/2 of their gradating class and pass all standardized graduating tests. 4-H'ers also need to have been active over at least 3 years with various projects, leadership, and community service. This is a tough scholarship and very intense and from my experience with scholarship winners, those receiving scholarships have had a minimum of 3 projects.

With the system that the scholarship is on now, County Agents are not required to review or approve submissions. I want to look over the applications to help 4-H'ers make their scholarships as strong as possible. Therefore, I am asking 4-H'ers who are working on scholarships to let me know and then send me a copy of your scholarship before hitting the submit button. I will need scholarship applications by January 12 to review and get suggestions back. Scholarships and all necessary attachments must be submitted by February 15.
