District 12 4-H Trap, Skeet & Whiz-Bang Shoot

The District 12 4-H Trap, Skeet, & Whiz-Bang Contest will be held on Saturday, March 26 at the South Texas Shooting Complex in Webb County just East of Laredo. The courses of fire will include 3 events: Trap, Skeet, and Whiz-Bang qualifying match for a total of 150 targets combines.

Registration will open on 4-H Online on February 22 and close on March 11. The registration fee is \$120 per contestant (150 targets). Contestants must also register on iClays for squadding information.

4-H Graduation Cords

Jim Wells County 4-H graduating seniors who have continued to stay involved in the 4-H program throughout their senior year, will earn their 4-H graduation cords. For seniors graduating in May or June, if the 4-H'er attends their 6 4-H



club meetings, participates in 3 county 4-H events or activities, and lets the Extension Office know by May 1, they will earn their green graduation cord. 4-H seniors will only earn their cords if they follow the guidelines as cords will need to be ordered and there will not be exceptions to earning your cords. County Events or activities could be a county 4-H community service, photography contest, 4-H contests that I have going on throughout the year each month, Cupcake Wars, AG ID, plus many more.

Rifle, Shotgun, and Archery Postal League Sign-Up

Sign-up is currently open for the District 12 4-H Postal League for Rifle, Shotgun, and Archery. The deadline for signing up for State Postal League is Friday, February 18. Postal Leagues are done in the county on the designated date set by the designated coaches. Registration is conducted on 4-H Online and if you are involved in multiple disciplines, you do one registration for all disciplines. Don't forget to get registered as there are no late registrations.

The 2022 Jim Wells County 4-H Photography Contest Rules and Entry Packet have been released and was shared in my email earlier in the week, as well as it is posted on our Jim Wells County website. You can pick up a packet at the Extension Office, on 4-H Connect, or https://jimwells.agrilife.org. Classes have changed for this year and are: animalsdomestic, animals—wildlife, Catch-All, Details and Macros, Elements of Design, Enhanced, Food, Landscape & Nature (Non-Animal), Leading Lines, Long Exposure, Motion/Action, People, Plant/Flora, Shadow/Silhouette, Theme (My Hometown). The theme category includes what is special, iconic, unique, or even quirky about your hometown. Capture what make it exceptional, historic, fun, or simply the best place to grow up.

Explanation of all the classes, along with entry forms and guidelines will be available in the next week or on the Extension website. Entries will be due no later than March 1.

State Indoor Archery Match

Registration for the State 4-H Indoor Archery Match in Carrizo Springs opened on February 1. If 4-H'ers are going to Rio Grande Valley Livestock Show Archery Contest, this can also serve as their indoor archery march as long as they register for it. Other State Indoor Archery Match sites that can be registered for are: Bay City (March 25-26), Carthage (March 25-26), Graham (March 25-26), Monahans (April 1-2). Registration deadline for Mercedes is February 18 and Bay City is March 10.

4-H & First Responders Luncheon

Agriculture Product ID

What is Ag Product ID? This is a contest in which youth are given 20 Texas agricultural products at separate stations. They select the correct identification of each product from four possible answers. Each station then has one multiple choice question pertaining to the product on display. That question is general to the industry that produced the product, (i.e. Texas' national ranking, economic impact to Texas, general nutritional content, region of production, cooking method, use, growing season, specific nutrition of the cut or variety). Youth are given 30 seconds at each station to answer both questions. Products can range from fruits, vegetables, herbs to seafood, poultry, chicken or beef. Practices coming up to come try it out will be: Wednesday, February 23 at 6:45 at the Home Economics Building and Wednesday, March 2 at 6:45.

Texas 4-H is going back to NASA's Johnson Space Center. This is an overnight "camping" experience held at the space center that will include hands-on STEM activities, an astronaut guest speaker, a tram tour of rocket park, and free roam of the museum's exhibits. It promises to be a great time for all space enthusiasts! Registration for Texas 4-H Night at NASA is open on 4-H Online thru February 15. The cost of the event is \$90. All youth attending must be accompanied by an adult chaperone. Adult chaperones must be screened 4-H volunteers.


